# » PROGRAM UPDATE

## OUR NEW OLYMPIA LOCATION

Thanks to your support our transition into a new office space in Olympia was both easy and smooth.

When we heard that our Olympia office would soon be turned into apartments, we were excited for the chance to find a more welcoming and bright location to better serve the South Sound community.



Because of your investment and the help of other donors, we were able to locate a new space and have it remodeled to better fit our clients' needs.

## OLYMPIA-AREA SERVICES

PCAF has provided HIV case management and prevention services in Olympia since 2012, after United Communities AIDS Network (UCAN) ceased operations

after 26 years. Through the Olympia office, PCAF connects with clients living in Thurston, Lewis, and Mason Counties.

When PCAF began services, our priority was to meet the immediate needs of our clients, so developing our image and community presence was put on hold.

Now PCAF is focused on engaging with the community so that we can become an even stronger asset for the South Sound.

## WHAT DOES HIV LOOK LIKE IN THE SOUTH SOUND?

Because of your generosity last year, PCAF served 159 people living with HIV out of the Olympia office. Of those, 55 people regularly came to PCAF for food, 35 people received housing assistance, and 28 people sought help with mental health issues. We also tested 67 community members for HIV.



The need for HIV services in the region continues to grow. **Since January of 2017, PCAF has already had 35 new clients walk through our doors seeking help.**

## WHO HELPED MAKE THIS TRANSITION POSSIBLE?

- You and other caring people helped secure a bright, new office space where clients and visitors feel welcome, dignified, and respected
- Community businesses and organizations reached out to form partnerships that will help us better serve those affected by HIV
- Local funders helped us increase sustainable resources for the HIV positive community
- Community members volunteered their time to help facilitate the moving of offices and set up of the new office space

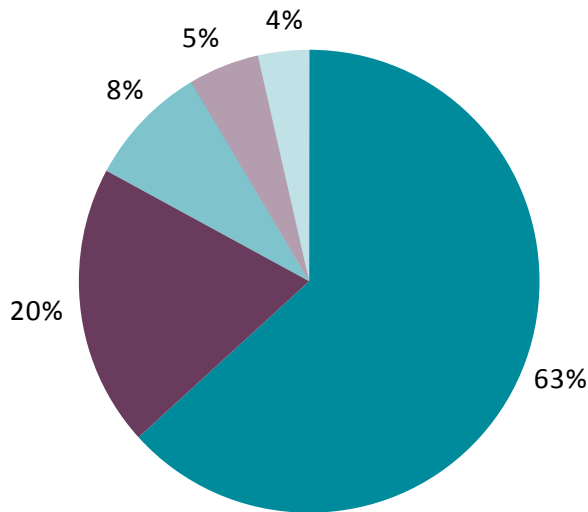
